**THE NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS, AS ADOPTED BY THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS AND EXPOSITIONS WILL BE IN EFFECT DURING ALL LIVESTOCK SHOWS.** These guidelines are found below.

### **INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF FAIRS & EXPOSITIONS (IAFE) NATIONAL CODE OF SHOW RING ETHICS**

Exhibitors of animals at livestock shows shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show. In addition to the "IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics," fairs and livestock shows may have rules and regulations which they impose on the local, county, state, provincial, and national levels.

All youth leaders working with junior exhibitors are under an affirmative responsibility to do more than avoid improper conduct or questionable acts. Their moral values must be so certain and positive that those younger and more pliable will be influenced by their fine example. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, and absolutely responsible persons who violate the code of ethics will forfeit premiums, awards, and auction proceeds and shall be prohibited from future exhibition in accordance with the rules adopted by the respective fairs and livestock shows. Exhibitors who violate this code of ethics demean the integrity of all livestock exhibitors and should be prohibited from competition at all livestock shows in the United States and Canada.

The following is a list of guidelines for all exhibitors and all livestock in competitive events:

1. All exhibitors must present, upon request of fair and livestock show officials, proof of ownership, length of ownership, and age of all animals entered. Misrepresentation of ownership, age, or any facts relating thereto is prohibited.
2. Owners, exhibitors, fitters, trainers, or absolutely responsible persons shall provide animals health certificates from licensed veterinarians upon request by fair or livestock show officials.
3. Junior exhibitors are expected to care for and groom their animals while at fairs or livestock shows.
4. Animals shall be presented to show events where they will enter the food chain free of volatile drug residues. This act of entering an animal in a livestock show is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainers and/or absolutely responsible person for show management to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood, or other substances from the animal to be used in testing. Animals not entered in an event which culminates with the animal entering the food chain shall not be administered drugs from other than in accordance with applicable federal, state, and provincial statutes, regulations and rules. Livestock shall not be exhibited if the drugs administered in accordance with federal, state and provincial statutes, regulations and rules affect the animal's performance or appearance at the event. If the laboratory report on the analysis of saliva, urine, blood, or other sample taken from livestock indicates the presence of forbidden drugs or medication, this shall be prima facie evidence such substance has been administered to the animal either internally or externally. It is presumed that the sample of urine, saliva, blood, or other substance tested by the approved laboratory to which it is sent is the one taken from the animal in question, its integrity is preserved, all procedures of said collection and preservation transfer to the laboratory, and analysis of the sample are correct and accurate. The report received from the laboratory pertains to the sample taken from the animal in question and correctly reflects the condition of the animal at the time the sample was taken, with the burden on the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible

person to prove otherwise. At any time after an animal arrives on the fair or livestock show premises, all treatments involving the use of drugs and/or medications for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal shall be administered by a licensed veterinarian.

5. Any surgical procedure or injection of any foreign substance or drug or external application of any substance (irritant, counterirritant or similar substance) which could affect the animal's performance or alter its natural contour, confirmation, or appearance, except external applications of substances to the hoofs or horns of animals which affect appearance only, and except for surgical procedures performed by a duly licensed veterinarian for the sole purpose of protecting the health of the animal, is prohibited.

6. The use of showing and/or handling practices or devices, such as striking animals to cause swelling using electrical contrivance, or other similar practices are not acceptable and are prohibited.

7. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, fair or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show official before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, fair and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation, and respect. No person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them.

8. No owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person shall conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of ethics or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of ethics. Violation of this rule shall subject such individual to disciplinary action.

9. The application of this code of ethics provides for absolute responsibility for an animal's condition by an owner, exhibitor, fitter, or participant whether or not he or she was actually instrumental in or had actual knowledge of the treatment of the animal in contravention of this code of ethics.

10. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person to have any disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show for violation of this Code of Show Ring Ethics and any other rules of competition of the fair or livestock show without recourse against the fair or livestock show. The act of entering an animal is the giving of consent that any proceedings or disciplinary action taken by the fair or livestock show may be published with the name of the violator or violators in any publication of the International Association of Fairs and Expositions, including Fairs and Expositions and any special notices to members.

11. The act of entering an animal in a fair or livestock show is the giving of verification by the owner, fitter, trainer, or absolutely responsible person that he or she has read the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and understands the consequences of and penalties provided for actions prohibited by this code. It is further a consent that an action which contravenes these rules and is also in violation of federal, state, or provincial statutes, regulations, or rules may be released to appropriate law enforcement authorities with jurisdiction over such infractions.



**General Rules  
Applies to all Species**

If an exhibitor has more than one entry per class, the additional animal must be shown by another youth exhibitor.

Exhibitors must show their own animal without assistance. For special accommodations please contact the Cumberland County Cooperative Extension office at 910-321-6862 at least seven (7) days in advance.

All decisions made by the judge will be **FINAL**.

## JUNIOR LAYING HEN SHOW

Open to all youth ages 5-18 as of January 1, 2017.

**Pre-registration is required. Deadline to pre-registration is Monday, August 28, at 5:00 pm Please contact Liz Lahti at (910)321-6862 to register.**

Chickens must be blood tested for Pullorumtyphoid. This will be done by a North Carolina Department of Agriculture representative at the Agri-Expo building at entry. Tests will be performed at no cost to the exhibitor.

All chickens exhibited must meet North Carolina Health Requirements. Animals must be healthy upon arrival or they will not be allowed to show.

All hens should be 12 months old or less.

Eight breed classes (American, English, Asiatic, Mediterranean, Continental, Polish, Bantams and No Official Breed Class); limit one hen per breed class. Must be pullets and will be shown as individuals. Hens will be grouped by age within each breed class. All participants are automatically entered in their respective showmanship classes.

Showmanship will be based on the Four Stages of Poultry Showmanship outlined in the 4-H Poultry Showmanship National Standard, University of California, Division of Agriculture and Natural Resources, publication 4-H-2060. Showmen should be prepared to do all outlined in the four stages, including the Nine Points of Inspection, answering questions, and posing the bird.

Hens will be entered between 4:00 p.m. – 6:00 p.m. on Monday, September 4, 2017 and are to be removed from the livestock arena by 10:00 p.m. the day of the show UNLESS the animals are entered in the static exhibit section.

**Note:** Limit one participation award per person for all participants who do not place.

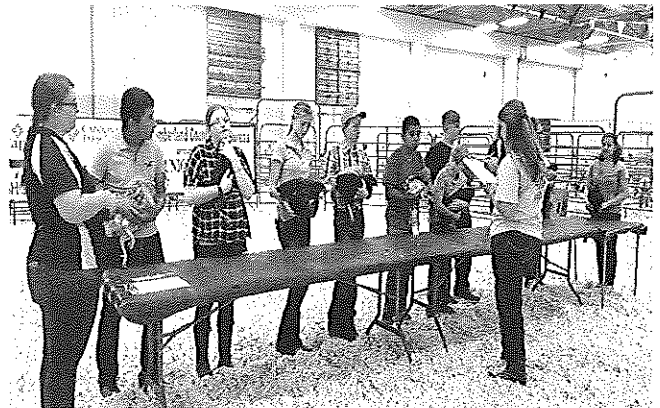

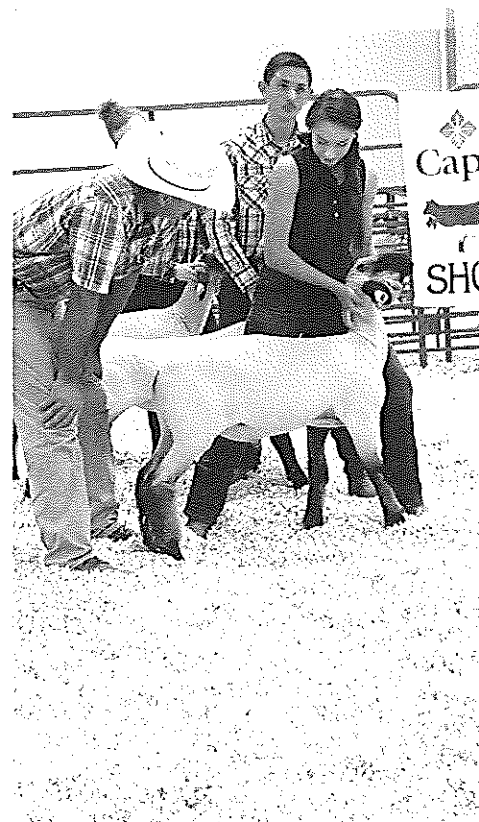

Show will be held **Wednesday, September 6, 2017** beginning at **5:00 pm**. Sale will begin at 7:30 pm. Animals will be shown in the following order:

1)Swine 2)Feeder Calves 3)Steers

Show is open to youth 5-18 years of age.

All hogs and beef cattle exhibited must meet North Carolina health requirements. Animals must be healthy upon arrival or they will not be allowed in the show.

Pre-registration is required.

**Pre-registration closes on Monday, August 28 at 5:00 pm. Please contact Liz Lahti at (910)321-6862 to register.**

Animals will be entered on Wednesday, September 6 from 11:00 am – 4:00 pm. Feeder Calf and Steer entries will be limited to one entry. Feeder calves must weigh between 400 and 700 pounds.

Swine entries are limited to one entry in each division. Hogs must weigh between 230 and 290 pounds. Animals outside this range may be shown, but will not be eligible for premiums. Swine classes are lightweight and heavyweight, divided as equally as possible at approximately 260 pounds.

An exhibitor must actually show their animal to receive a premium. The only exception is in the case of swine exhibitors having two animals in the championship drive. He or she may have someone else to show one of the animals.

The auction will begin at 7:30 pm. Each swine exhibitor who does not win Grand or Reserve Champion may sell one of their animals during the auction.

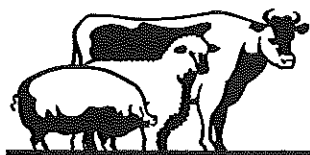

Due to space restrictions - a limit of 30 hogs for the Show has been established. Cumberland County exhibitors will receive priority for show registration. Exhibitors from outside counties will be placed on a waiting list until the registration deadline has been met. Once the deadline has passed, exhibitors from other counties will be registered for show participation, if space allows, based on the date the registration from was received. Those that are entered will be notified.

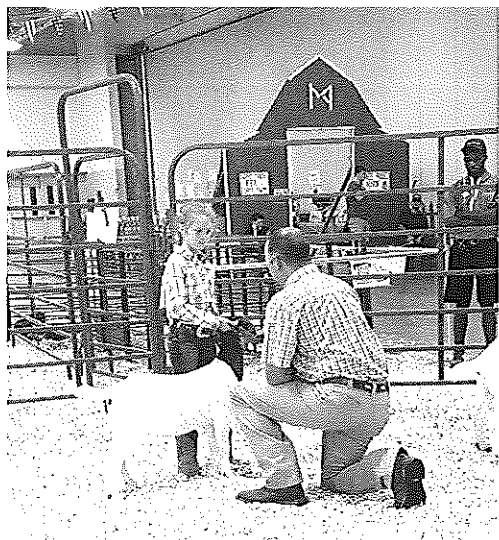

All beef cattle exhibited must meet North Carolina health requirements. Animals must be healthy upon arrival or they will not be allowed in the show.

Heifers must be born on or after November 1, 2015, but not later than May 31, 2017.

Heifers must be halter broken. Unruly animals that endanger the safety of exhibitors will be asked to leave the ring.

Exhibitors must have trained and fitted the animal from June 30, 2017. Ownership by exhibitors is not required; however, in cases where exhibitors do not own the animal, a certificate of training a fitting from the owner is required at entry. The exhibitor must actually show their animal to receive a premium. The only exception is when an exhibitor has more than one animal in the ring at one time. Classes will be limited to ten (10) entries. Classes with more than ten (10) entries will be divided. All animals are to be removed from the livestock area by 10:00 p.m. the day of the show unless the animals are entered in the static exhibit section. All participants are automatically entered in their respective showmanship classes.

All animals exhibited MUST meet North Carolina Health requirements. Animals must be healthy and clean upon arrival or they will not be allowed to exhibit. All goats and lambs must have a Scrapie Ear Tag upon arrival. Untagged animals will be disqualified. Horses must have their health papers available for inspection and have proof of a negative Coggins Test for Equine Infectious Anemia. Horses not meeting these requirements will not be allowed to exhibit.

No un-altered males may be entered.

**All livestock must be cared for by exhibitor which includes: feeding, watering, cleaning stalls, etc.**

Judging will be done by the Danish System.
