Regional Chicken Project Rules

- 1. Participants must be between the ages of 5 18, as of January 1 to participate in the program. They must be a 4-H member or a student who is taking an agriculture education class or an FFA member of a participating school. Youth can enroll in their county 4-H program to participate.
- 2. All first time participants must attend orientation training and a showmanship/project book training hosted by Cooperative Extension or a High School Ag Ed Program. These meetings will be held in multiple locations. Participants will be expected to do formal 4-H poultry showmanship and those guidelines will be distributed and explained at these meetings, along with general information about raising birds. Youth who participated in the Chick Chain Show and Sales in November 2014 and/or the Regional Chicken Project in 2015, 2016, or 2017 can get an exemption from their agent or teacher to not participate in the orientation training, but will need to attend the showmanship training.
- 3. Each participant will receive a maximum of 10 chicks, approximately the same age.
 - a. 2 broilers (meat birds) are \$10. The broilers will be returned to the chicken project committee, which will process the birds and donate the meat to local food banks.
 - b. 6 laying hen chicks are \$25 this can be 6 of one breed or 3 Red Sex Links & 3 Black Laced Silver Wyandottes. 10 laying hen chicks are \$35– this can be 10 of one breed or 5 Red Sex Links & 5 Black Laced Silver Wyandottes.
 - c. Youth can show in multiple breed classes if you purchase multiple breeds, but you must choose 1 bird for showmanship.
 - d. Families and agricultural education classes can split birds, but every child must have their own bird they are responsible for.
 - e. There is a \$5 fee for each extra child when splitting birds.
 - f. Wing bands are available for an additional charge of \$0.15 per bird. You do not have to get wing bands, but may be helpful if multiple youth are showing birds that are kept together.
- 4. Participant will raise the chicks until the date of the April show under the supervision of the guardians or agricultural education class with help from Extension Agents and Teachers.
- 5. The project will be canceled if the ban on showing chickens is in effect due to the threat of Avian Influenza. Money paid will be refunded if canceled.
- 6. Participant will be responsible for all expenses incurred while raising the chickens (feed, medication, facility, etc.).
- 7. Participant will present 1 bird received from the Regional Chicken Project per class to show on Thursday, April 26th. If you purchased multiple breeds for this project, you can show 1 bird in each breed class. The show will be at the White Lake FFA Camp in Bladen County. A qualified adult will judge the show. A NC Department of Agriculture Poultry Inspector will inspect/test the birds for parasites/disease. Tentative time for the show date is 4:15-5:15 pm for registration and inspection of the bird by NCDA and show to start at 5:30 pm.
- 8. If you have a disaster (loss of multiple birds), you <u>must</u> contact your local county Extension Agent or Agricultural Education Teacher immediately (within 24 hours) so they may verify the situation and/or provide photographic evidence.
- 9. There will be no auction, but the committee can help find buyers if needed.

- 10. Poultry Record Book must be completed and turned by Thursday, April 19 by 5pm to your Livestock or 4-H agent or your Ag. Ed. Teacher before the birds can be exhibited at the Chicken Show. *If record books are not turned in then youth will not be allowed to exhibit in the show. There will be different recordbooks for 4-H and FFA/ag ed classes. These will include a supplemental packet with learning activities about chickens.
- 11. All decisions by the judge are final. Direct criticism or interference with the judge, show or livestock show management, other exhibitors, breed representatives, or show officials before, during, or after the competitive event is prohibited. In the furtherance of their official duty, all judges, show, and livestock show management, or other show officials shall be treated with courtesy, cooperation and respect and no person shall direct abusive or threatening conduct toward them. Potential disqualification from future events after review is possible.
- 12. Registration forms and entry fees per participant are due by January 2nd for hen chicks and by February 2nd for broilers. Forms and checks must be submitted by 5:00 pm on the due date to your county's Extension office or your Agriculture Education teacher. Anticipated bird arrival date is mid-February for laying hen chicks and March 9-13th for broilers.
- 13. Any special considerations not covered in the rules will be decided by the Regional Chicken Project Committee.
- 14. Awards given are as follows:

SHOWMANSHIP:

AGES 5-8: all receive a medal JUNIOR- ages 9-13: 1st-5th places receives ribbon and 1st- \$25, 2nd- \$20, 3rd- \$15, 4th-\$10 and 5th- \$5. All others receive a ribbon. SENIOR- ages 14-18: 1st-5th places receives ribbon and 1st- \$25, 2nd- \$20, 3rd- \$15, 4th-\$10 and 5th- \$5. All others receive a ribbon.

RECORD BOOKS:

 Ages 5-8: all receive a ribbon

 Prizes for each division:

 4-H Division 9-10, 11-12, 13-15, 16-18: 1st- \$15, 2nd- \$10, 3rd, \$5

 FFA/ Ag Ed Division: 6-8 grade, 9-12 grade: 1st- \$15, 2nd- \$10, 3rd, \$5
