Be a Hunger Hero: 2022 NC Youth Institute

All high school youth are invited to join the <u>2022 North Carolina Youth Institute</u> (NCYI), a program that provides a platform for youth to research and give recommendations to solve key global challenges that range from food insecurity, access to potable water, poverty, human rights, engineering issues, and more.

- <u>Write a paper</u>: Youth select a country besides their own and research the challenges families face around food and write a paper with proposed community-based solutions.
- Youth **present their paper** to their peers at the in-person NCYI at NC State and work collectively to find common themes around global hunger.
- Participate in **hands-on workshops.** Youth will have a chance to explore handson sessions led by faculty across CALS to learn more about NC agriculture and food systems.
- Become a Borlaug Scholar. After participating in the NCYI, youth will be named a

Borlaug Scholar by the World Food Prize.

The NCYI is hosted by NC State University's College of Agriculture and Life Sciences and the Department of Crop and Soil Sciences and is a part of the the World Food Prize's Global Youth Institute.

Youth will need to register and submit their paper by March 4, 2022 (registration opens soon) and the in-person, one-day NCYI will be held at NC State on Friday, April 1, 2022.

<u>4-H Shooting Sports</u> **Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP)** Scholarship

The Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) offers scholarships to high school seniors. To be eligible, you need to compete in some CMP matches. Crosse Creek Rifle and Pistol Club holds a CMP Rimfire Sporter match on the 5th Saturday of each month (the next one will be on January 29, 2022). These matches are open to the public, anyone under 18 must be accompanied by an adult. 4-H members can use 4-H rifles and ammunition and a 4-H Shooting Sports volunteer will run you through the match program.
